LICAF is a well-established event taking place each year in the UK's Lake District and featuring the best in comic art from around the world. As well as showcasing great international comic artists and writers, having worked with 32 countries to date, we have an equally strong commitment to raising the profile of the great British comic art being produced and putting a spotlight on the independent sector.

Our mission is to raise the profile of British work and to help facilitate its journey into other parts of the world, into as many countries and languages as possible through the selling of rights, translation of works and more. To date our initiative has included delegations to international festivals in Asia, North America and Europe and a new International Rights Market at our annual festival, focusing on the selling of British Comics to overseas publishers. It aims to provide a snapshot of British comics focussing on work available to buy, publish and distribute in other countries and languages.
